SPRING YARDS!

Spring has begun! Here's helpful advice from our Landscaping Committee:

Lawncare: It's important to spray your grass for weeds. Left unchecked, the weeds will crowd out your Bermuda grass and then, when the hot summer sun kills the weeds, the grass there will be dead, too. Plus weeds send seeds to your neighbors' yards and just keep spreading.

Lawn Clippings: Please do not toss your lawn clippings into the creek area or the overflow channel behind Branch Line. The rains take it away and it is clogging our drainage system. The overflow channel now has to be cleaned out, which is a costly undertaking. Use your trash bins for the clippings.

Bugs: Watch for insects such as bagworms, aphids, scale, tree borers, etc. Just like weeds, these insects multiply and move to your neighbors' trees, bushes, and flowers. Please keep them in check so they don't spread.

Trees: The biggest problem that occurs is a lack of water during dry periods. New trees need more water until their root structure is established. Mulching around your trees and bushes will help keep them from drying out so quickly. Remember, grass and weeds rob nutrients from your trees.

Choosing the Right Tree/Bush: Many plants will grow here, but some grow better. We live in USDA Zone 7a, so our temperature can go down to 0. Check the tag for the height/spread of the full-grown tree/shrub and sun needs. Many choices: deciduous, evergreen, flowering, shape, fast/slow grower, fruit, disease-resistant, etc. Find more info at extension.okstate.edu
